What to bring to apply:

- ⇒ Proof of income for Household
- ⇒ A 12-month printout from all sources of heat and cooling for the past year
- ⇒ Social Security cards and date of births for all household members

Low Income Home
Energy Assistance Program

LIHEAP



The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program is funded through the Tennessee Housing Development Agency. These services are available to all eligible recipients regardless of race, color, age, religion, disability or national origin.

Who is Eligible?

Anyone who is interested may complete an application. Eligible households must meet income guidelines and must provide documentation of all household income. The total gross annual income must not exceed the Federal Income Guidelines. You must also provide a printout from all energy providers of the past 12 months energy usage. The number of eligible households who receive assistance depends upon the amount of funding that Douglas-Cherokee Economic Authority receives from the Tennessee Housing Development Agency. Our fiscal year begins on July 1st and ends on June 30th each year. Applicants can only be served one time within the fiscal year with either a \$300.00, \$450.00 or \$600.00 one time payment that will be paid DIRECTLY to the Energy Vendor. The Vendor does have to be enrolled with Douglas-Cherokee Economic Authority as a valid recipient and most reputable energy vendors are already enrolled. We have a listing of home delivered fuel and wood vendors for applicants to choose from for each county.



What type of assistance is available?

Regular LIHEAP Assistance:

Regular LIHEAP is Energy Assistance that is based on applications that are taken in 4 intake periods per year, those are taken in July, October, January and April. The applications are then processed and "scored" or given "points" based on each household's needs. Households are given extra points for poverty level, disabilities, children under age 6 and elderly household members. Depending on the amount of funding we have at the time of payments each quarter, the households with the highest points will be served. We serve the "neediest of the needy" and then if any money is left it is paid out through the fiscal year to the households on the "waiting list". An approved application is not a guarantee of service, it is all dependent on the funding available.

CRISIS/ Emergency Assistance:

Crisis/Emergency funding is reserved for families that are in crisis and have a cut off notice or have already been cut off. The household must have a family member that is under the age of 6, disabled, age 60 or older or a household that has experienced an uncontrollable/unexpected loss of financial resources due to no fault of their own. An uncontrollable/ unexpected loss of income could include a household wage earner losing employment, significant loss of work hours, unable to work due to illness with no sick leave, death of a wage earner, a wage earner leaving the household, a major household expense that is more than the energy expenses or an extremely high energy bill due to a malfunctioning heating/ cooling system. These definitions all require appropriate documentation and can be further explained by our staff. The eligible applicant for Crisis would be given a voucher to provide to the Energy Vendor on the date of service.





What is Douglas-Cherokee Economic Authority?

We are a non-profit agency that has several programs with the common goal of helping the low-income families in many East Tennessee counties to become self-sufficient. Our programs are unique and diverse but all focus on the needs of the communities we serve. We do everything from creating jobs, to teaching young children through Head Start, helping folks to enroll in college, working with school age children in afterschool programs, school age tutoring, school age college prep, emergency assistance with rent, medication, food, energy assistance, affordable housing, Career First, meals for Seniors delivered to their homes and commodities.
